

December 2010 - January 2011

Nonfarm payroll jobs in Arkansas decreased 19,900 in January to total 1,152,200. Eight major industry sectors posted declines, more than offsetting minor gains in three sectors. The greatest loss occurred in **trade**, **transportation**, **and utilities** (-5,600), attributed mostly to the seasonal drop in retail trade. **Government** (-4,800) and **educational and health services** (-1,500) both posted seasonal declines related to school employment. Seasonal fluctuations also caused decreases in **leisure and hospitality** (-3,000) and **construction** (-2,500).

January 2010 - January 2011

Since January 2010, nonfarm payroll employment increased 18,100. Nine major industry sectors enjoyed annual growth, while two posted losses. The largest increase occurred in **professional and business services** (+5,600), with administrative and support services experiencing most of the growth (+5,300). **Leisure and hospitality** and **trade, transportation, and utilities** both added 3,900 jobs, each. Jobs in **educational and health services** rose 3,000, mostly caused by growth in social assistance (+2,400). **Construction** posted the largest annual decline (-2,000).

New in 2011

Arkansas Civilian Labor Force Summary:

In accordance with U.S. Department of Labor guidelines, Civilian Labor Force data underwent the annual revision process dating back to January 2006. The revised statewide information is available on the Discover Arkansas website at www.discover.arkansas.gov. Revised data for the Metropolitan Statistical Areas, counties, cities and Workforce Investment Areas should be available May 6, 2011.

Arkansas Nonfarm Payroll Jobs:

Nonfarm employment estimates from April 2009 through December 2010 have been revised and are available on the Discover Arkansas website.

Additionally, due to lack of information, repair and maintenance will no longer be a subset of the other services sector. These jobs will still be counted and included in other services but will not be shown in a separate subsector category.

Bureau of Labor Statistics Changes:

The U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), is implementing a plan to centralize the process for producing Current Employment Statistics (CES). Beginning with the March 2011 preliminary CES estimates, the production of Statewide and Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) employment estimates will transition from state workforce agencies to national BLS. State agencies will provide limited input into the estimates but will maintain responsibility for disseminating the estimates to the public. Additionally, several methodological changes are being made to the estimation process to ensure standardization throughout each state. These changes were designed to improve cost efficiency in the CES program.







Unemployment Rates by County

Between December 2010 and January 2011, unemployment rates increased in 74 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Nevada County was the only county to enjoy a rate decline over-the-month. Jobless rates ranged from a low of 6.2 percent in Miller County to a high of 18.7 percent in Arkansas County.

In January, no county posted rates at or below six percent. Thirty-two counties had rates at or above ten percent, up from seventeen counties in December.


Compared to January 2010, unemployment rates are down in 45 counties. Twenty-four counties posted rate increases, while six remained the same.

Technical Notes

The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous data are subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2010 benchmark.

Explanation of Terms and Concepts

Monthly Business Survey of Employers

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, full-or part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the

month. Approximately 3,000 Arkansas business establishments are surveyed.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

Current Population Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 800 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

Civilian Labor Force

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

Employment

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

Unemployment

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

Unemployment Rate

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates in this publication are calculated from unrounded data.

Seasonal Adjustment

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, shifts in schedules, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.
