

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# **Nonfarm Payroll Employment**

## **State of Arkansas**

#### April 2014 - May 2014

Arkansas' nonfarm payroll jobs rose 1,800 in May to total 1,198,000. Eight major industry sectors added jobs, with declines posted in three sectors. **Educational and health services** increased 1,100. Gains in health care and social assistance (+1,400) offset the minor seasonal losses in educational services (-300). Employment in **construction** rose 800, a typical seasonal expansion. A large portion of the hiring was reported in heavy and civil engineering construction. Jobs in **government** declined 1,000. All losses were in state government (-1,600), related to the start of summer break at public colleges and universities.

#### May 2013 - May 2014

Since May 2013, nonfarm payroll jobs in Arkansas have increased 13,500. Six major industry sectors posted growth, while four sectors declined slightly, and one was unchanged. Trade, transportation, and utilities added 4,800 jobs. Retail trade reported a majority of the gain (+3,100). Jobs in leisure and hospitality rose 3,000. Most of the expansion was in food services (+2,800), particularly in limited service restaurants. Educational and health services increased 2,700. All growth occurred in health care and social assistance (+2,800). Manufacturing added 1,900 jobs, mostly in durable goods manufacturing (+1,400). Jobs in construction rose 1,500. A majority of the additions were in specialty trade contractors (+800).


# **Wages in Arkansas**

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) is the most comprehensive data collection program utilized by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The program is based on each state's Unemployment Insurance (UI) program, which enables BLS to produce data using every business that is covered under UI tax law. In addition to calculating covered employment, the program also tracks the wages paid to employees. Due to the comprehensive nature of the information, data can be produced at any level-- national, statewide, counties, and cities.

The information below comes from the QCEW program and provides annual average wage data for each county in Arkansas. Annual average wages are calculated using the total wages earned during the calendar year, divided by annual average employment. The wages are compiled using all industries and includes both private and government jobs, for all workers included under UI tax law. It is also important to note that QCEW data is based on county of employment, not county of residency. So if an individual works in a different county than where they live, their wages are counted in the county where they work.

In 2013, average annual wages ranged from a high of \$52,752, for those employed in Benton County, to a low of \$23,727 in Searcy County. The map below represents the wages of Arkansas workers by county, with wages divided into six different monetary ranges.







Between April and May, unemployment rates increased in 46 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Twentyone counties enjoyed jobless rate declines, while eight remained stable.

In May, twenty-three counties posted rates at or below six percent. No county had an unemployment rate above ten percent, down from one county in April.

Compared to May 2013, jobless rates are down in 74 counties. Only one county posted a higher rate than this time last year.



# **Technical Notes**

The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous data are subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2013 benchmark.

#### **Explanation of Terms and Concepts**

#### **Monthly Business Survey of Employers**

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, full-or part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th

of the month. Approximately 5,000 Arkansas business establishments are surveyed.

#### Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

#### **Current Population Survey (CPS)**

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 800 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

#### **Civilian Labor Force**

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

### **Employment**

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

#### **Unemployment**

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

#### **Unemployment Rate**

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

#### **Seasonal Adjustment**

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.
