

Nonfarm Payroll Jobs

December 2014 - January 2015

Arkansas' nonfarm payroll employment declined 18,000 in January to total 1,190,400. Nine major industry sectors posted losses, while one sector increased and one remained stable. Jobs in **government** fell 6,100. Declines in state (-4,300) and local (-1,500) government were attributed to the closure of public schools and universities for winter break. Employment in trade, transportation, and utilities dropped 6,000. Losses were mostly seasonal, related to the end of temporary holiday hiring. **Manufacturing** decreased 2,400, affecting both nondurable (-1,400) and durable (-1,000) goods manufacturing. Jobs in educational and health services are down 1,100, spurred by seasonal losses. Leisure and hospitality declined 1,100, mostly in food services (-1,000).

January 2014 - January 2015

Since January 2014, nonfarm payroll jobs in Arkansas rose 29,500. Nine major industry sectors posted growth, with six adding 2,600 or more jobs, each. Employment in trade, transportation, and utilities increased 7,700. Expansions occurred in all three subsectors. Leisure and hospitality added 6,700 jobs, largely in food services (+5,600). Professional and business services rose 5,400. Most of the gains were in administrative and support services (+3,900), which includes employment agencies. Jobs in construction increased 3,300, with specialty trade contractors reporting a majority of the growth (+2,200). Educational and health services added 2,600 jobs, mostly in health care and social assistance (+2,400). Employment in manufacturing rose 2,600. Durable goods manufacturing reported an increase of 1,700 jobs.

Spotlight

Changes Affecting Data

Arkansas Civilian Labor Force:

In accordance with the U.S. Department of Labor guidelines, Arkansas' Civilian Labor Force (CLF) estimates have undergone an annual processing. The purpose of annual processing is to incorporate more complete and accurate information into the estimation process. This year however, more extensive changes were made. CLF calculations have now incorporated the 2010 U.S. Census Bureau population changes and updates to employment commuting patterns. Because these changes will date back to 2010, the Bureau of Labor Statistics took this opportunity to make methodological changes as well.

All levels of data—State, counties, Metropolitan Statistical Areas, Micropolitan Statistical Areas, and cities- have been revised. United States and state level data have been re-estimated back to 1976. Small area estimates have been re-estimated back to 1990. New statewide CLF estimates have already been published, while all sub-state CLF estimates are set to be released on April 21, 2015, at www.bls.gov. New estimates should be available on the Discover Arkansas website by early May.

Due to the implementation of the 2010 Census data, there have also been changes to the composition of the Fort Smith Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). Franklin County no longer meets the criteria required to be included in the Fort Smith MSA. The MSA is now comprised of Crawford County and Sebastian County in Arkansas and LeFlore County and Sequoyah County in Oklahoma. Franklin County has been removed from the estimates back to January 1990.

Arkansas Nonfarm Payroll Jobs:

In accordance with the U.S. Department of Labor guidelines, nonfarm payroll job estimation has also undergone an annual processing. State and MSA estimates for 2013 and 2014 were recently revised and are currently available on the Discover Arkansas website. Franklin County has also been removed from the nonfarm payroll job total for the Fort Smith MSA, with the changes going back to 1990.







In January, sixteen counties enjoyed unemployment rates at or below six percent. Seven counties posted rates at or above ten percent, up from one county in December.


Compared to January 2014, jobless rates are down in seventy Arkansas counties. Rates increased in four counties, while one remained the same.

Technical Notes

The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous data are subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2014 benchmark.

Explanation of Terms and Concepts

Monthly Business Survey of Employers

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, full-or part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the

month. Approximately 5,000 Arkansas business establishments are surveyed.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

Current Population Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 800 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

Civilian Labor Force

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

Employment

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

<u>Unemployment</u>

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

Unemployment Rate

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

Seasonal Adjustment

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.
