

February 2015 - March 2015

Arkansas' nonfarm payroll employment rose 4,000 in March to total 1,202,600. Eight major industry sectors added jobs, while two declined and one remained stable. Employment in leisure and hospitality increased 2,300. Gains were largely seasonal and spread throughout all subsectors. Trade, transportation, and utilities added 1,000 jobs. Hiring in both retail (+600) and wholesale (+600) trade was related in part to the start of the spring shopping season. Employment in government rose 1,000, due in part to seasonal winter activities in both state (+700) and local (+300) government. Construction declined 2,000, as many projects were temporarily shut down due to weather conditions.

March 2014 - March 2015

Compared to March 2014, nonfarm payroll jobs in Arkansas have increased 22,100. Nine major industry sectors posted gains, while two sectors decreased slightly. Jobs in leisure and hospitality rose 7,200. A majority of the increase was in food services (+5,900), reported in both full and limited service restaurants. Trade, transportation, and utilities added 5,700 jobs. Growth occurred in all three subsectors. Employment in educational and health services rose 3,300, mostly in health care and social assistance (+2,900). Professional and business services increased 2,200. Gains were in management of companies (+1,600) and administrative and support services (+1,400).


Wages in Arkansas

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) is the most comprehensive data collection program utilized by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The program is based on each state's Unemployment Insurance (UI) program, which enables BLS to produce data using every business that is covered under UI tax law. In addition to calculating covered employment, the program also tracks the wages paid to employees. Due to the comprehensive nature of the information, data can be produced at any level-- national, statewide, counties, and cities.

The information below comes from the QCEW program and provides annual average wage data for each county in Arkansas. Annual average wages are calculated using the total wages earned during the calendar year, divided by annual average employment. The wages are compiled using all industries and includes both private and government jobs, for all workers included under UI tax law. It is important to note that QCEW data is based on county of employment, not county of residency. So if an individual works in a different county than where they live, their wages are counted in the county where they work.

In 2014, average annual wages ranged from a high of \$53,391, for those employed in Benton County, to a low of \$22,893 in Newton County. The map below represents the wages of Arkansas workers by county, with wages divided into six different monetary ranges.







Unemployment Rates by County

Between February and March, unemployment rates declined in 66 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Rates increased in six counties, while three counties were stable over the month.

In March, twenty-eight counties enjoyed jobless rates at or below six percent. Only one county posted an unemployment rate at or above ten percent, down from two counties in February.


Compared to March 2013, jobless rates are down in 73 Arkansas counties. One county posted an over-the-year rate increase, while one county was the same.

Technical Notes

The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous data are subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2014 benchmark.

Explanation of Terms and Concepts

Monthly Business Survey of Employers

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, full-or part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the

month. Approximately 5,000 Arkansas business establishments are surveyed.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

Current Population Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 800 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

Civilian Labor Force

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

Employment

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

<u>Unemployment</u>

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

Unemployment Rate

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

Seasonal Adjustment

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.

Arkansas Labor Market March 2015

The Arkansas Labor Market is produced by the Department of Workforce Services, Bureau of Labor Statistics. All Statistics are published in cooperation with the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.
