The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous month's data is subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2019 benchmark.

Explanation of Terms and Concepts

Monthly Business

Survey of Employers

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry infor-mation on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bu-reau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, fullor part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the month. Approximately

5,000 Arkansas business establishments are surveyed.

Metropolitan

Statistical Areas

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

Current Population

Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 800 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

Civilian Labor Force

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

Employment

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time

for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

Unemployment

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

Unemployment

<u>Rate</u>

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

<u>Seasonal</u>

Adjustment

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.

FEBRUARY SPOTLIGHT Alternative Measure of Labor Underutilization

In addition to the unemployment rate, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) also calculates five additional estimates based on various definitions of 'unemployment'. These are known as Alternative Measures of Labor Underutilization and are referred to as U1-U6, with U-3 as the official unemployment rate. These measures are calculated using data from the Current Population Survey (CPS), a monthly survey conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. Approximately 1,000 Arkansas households are in the survey each month.

Alternative Measures of Labor Underutilization are available at the statewide level and are produced quarterly. Estimates are calculated using a four quarter moving average. The most recent data available is for Annual Average 2019.

The following definitions are used to calculate each measure of Labor Underutilization:

U-1 Measure: Persons unemployed for 15 weeks or longer, as a percent of the civilian labor force.


U-2 Measure: Job losers and persons who completed temporary jobs, as a percent of the civilian labor force.

U-3 Measure: Total number of unemployed persons, as a percent of the civilian labor force (this is the definition used for the official unemployment rate).

U-4 Measure: Total number of unemployed and discouraged workers, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus discouraged workers.

U-5 Measure: Total number of unemployed, discouraged workers, and all other marginally attached workers, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus marginally attached workers.

U-6 Measure: Total number of unemployed, discouraged workers, marginally attached workers, and those employed part-time for economic reasons (not by choice), as a percent of the civilian labor force plus marginally attached workers.


Civilian Labor Force Summary

Labor force data, produced by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics and released by the Arkansas Division of Workforce Services, show Arkansas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.5 percent in February. Arkansas' civilian labor force added 970, a result of 1,239 more employed and 269 fewer unemployed Arkansans. The United States' jobless rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point, from 3.6 percent in January to 3.5 percent in February.

BLS Program Operations Manager Susan Price said, "Arkansas' unemployment rate has remained stable at 3.5 percent since October 2019. While the number of unemployed has declined for the last six consecutive months, the movement was not enough to impact the unemployment rate overall."


Nonfarm Payroll Job Summary

January 2020 - February 2020

Nonfarm payroll jobs in Arkansas rose 100 in February to total 1,269,800. Three major industry sectors added jobs, more than offsetting declines in five sectors. Job totals in three major sectors were unchanged. **Professional and business services** posted the largest increase, up 3,100. Most of the expansion was in administrative and support services (+2,500), a subsector which includes employment agencies. **Government** added 2,000 jobs. Gains were mostly in state government, educational services (+2,100), attributed to the re-opening of public colleges and universities after holiday break. Jobs in **trade, transportation, and utilities** decreased 3,000. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities posted a majority of the reduction (-2,500), with reported losses in delivery services and trucking.

February 2019 - February 2020

Compared to February 2019, Arkansas' nonfarm payroll jobs are down 3,300. Six major industry sectors posted declines, while employment in five sectors increased. The largest decrease occurred in **manufacturing** (-3,800). Durable goods reported most of the loss (-3,300), due to reductions in fabricated metal product manufacturing and the production of transportation equipment. Jobs in **leisure and hospitality** are down 2,600, mostly in food services (-2,500). **Government** employment declined 1,700. A majority of the loss occurred in local government (-2,100), all in the educational services subsector (-2,400). Employment in **financial activities** decreased 1,000, all in finance and insurance (-1,100). **Educational and health services** added 3,700 jobs. Increases were largely in health care and social assistance (+3,500), with ambulatory health care accounting for most of the gains (+2,900).











County Labor Force Summary


Between January and February, unemployment rates declined in 61 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Rates increased in eight counties while six counties remained stable. Jobless rates ranged from a low of 2.5 percent in Washington County to a high of 8.8 percent in Chicot County.

In February, twenty counties posted unemployment rates at or below four percent. That is up slightly from 16 counties at or below four percent in January. Four counties reported jobless rates at or above seven percent, the same number as last month.

Compared to February 2019, unemployment rates are down in 38 Arkansas counties. Rates were up over-the-year in twenty-nine counties, while jobless rates in eight counties were the same.
