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Definitions of Important Terms

Base Employment – The average number of jobs in a particular industry or occupation during the benchmark year or quarter.

Content Skills – Learned capabilities that allow workers to master and perform the specific activities of their jobs.

Current Employment Statistics (CES) – A monthly survey of business establishments that provides estimates of employment, hours, and earnings data by industry for the nation as a whole, all states, and most major metropolitan areas.

Employment – The number of jobs in a business or firm at any given time.

Establishment – The physical location of a certain economic activity, for example, a factory, mine, store, or office. Generally, a single establishment produces a single good or provides a single service.

Fastest Growing/Declining – Refers to percent growth. The higher the percent growth, the faster an industry or occupation is growing. For declining industries or occupations, the lower the percent growth, the faster it is declining.

Generalized Work Activities – The types of tasks that are common to many jobs.

Industry – A group of establishments that produce similar products or provide similar services.

Knowledge Domain – Learned sets of facts and standards required by many work situations.

Metropolitan Statistical Area – A county or group of contiguous counties that contains an urban center of at least 50,000 residents and has a high degree of economic and social ties.

Net Growth – The difference between projected employment and base employment.

North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) – A system used in assigning industry-designated code numbers to employers and/or establishments based on the nature of their activities, services rendered or products delivered; established by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget and used by all agencies for data compilation.

Occupation – A set of activities that employees are paid to perform; employees who perform the same tasks are in the same occupation, whether or not they are in the same industry.

Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) – A federal/state cooperative program that produces employment and wage estimates for over 700 occupations. These are estimates of the number of people employed in certain occupations and estimates of the wages paid to them. They are also used to gather occupational staffing patterns by industry that are used to project employment needs by occupation.

Percent (%) Growth - The rate at which an industry or occupation is expected to grow or decline.

Projected Employment - The average number of jobs expected to be in an industry or occupation in the future.

Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) – A federal/state cooperative program that produces employment and wage data for workers covered by State unemployment insurance laws and Federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees Program; data is arranged by the type of industry according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS).

Sector – A level of industry classification under supersector according to the NAICS structure.

Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) – A coding system used by all federal statistical agencies to classify workers into occupational categories for the purpose of collecting, calculating, or disseminating data.

Subsector – A level of industry classification under sector according to the NAICS structure.

Supersector - The top level of industry classification according to the NAICS structure.

Introduction

The Arkansas Long-Term Industry and Occupational Projections publication includes an overview of where the Arkansas labor market may be heading in the distant future. It contains information on the growth and decline of industries and occupations.

Industries in this publication are classified by North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes. NAICS was created to bring consistency and comparability to the classifying of industries and businesses across the United States, Canada, and Mexico.

This publication is divided into two main parts. The first part of the publication involves the industry projections. Several tables and graphs are used to show what is happening at the industry level in Arkansas. A written narrative highlights projections at the division level as well as key industries within that division.

The second part of this publication involves occupational projections. Several tables and graphs are used to show what is happening at the occupation level in Arkansas. A written narrative will highlight projections at the division level as well as key occupations within that division. Occupations are classified by Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes.

Information about annual job openings is included in this publication. Job openings are classified as one of two types: replacement or growth. The more replacement openings a specific occupation has, the higher the turnover for that occupation. It is important to look at both growth annual openings and replacement annual openings when determining whether a particular occupation is right for you.

For each occupation, an education/training level will be provided. Educational requirements are determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and recognize the educational attainment of most people in a particular occupation. Each occupation will have three categories of training, education, work experience, and job training. Some businesses, however, may require a higher level of training. Some occupations may also have different grades or levels that require different levels of training. These various levels of training will not be reflected in this publication.

The need for workers to have certain skills has become increasingly important in the labor market. A part of the publication presents the top skills that are in demand for new jobs and for jobs being replaced. Top work activities and types of knowledge are also presented.

Methodology

The following shows a brief overview of the methods used to produce long-term employment projections in Arkansas.

Data Development

Data development is accomplished by using three sources:

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wage reports. This source provides all the covered employment for Arkansas. A firm or business is considered "covered" if it meets the guidelines established under the Unemployment Insurance Law.

The Current Employment Statistics Survey. This source provides employment information for non-covered establishments, which are railroads, the Federal Work Study Program, churches, religious-based schools, church-related day care centers, elected officials, commissioned insurance agents, and sheltered workshops.

Agriculture employment. This is obtained from the Census of Agriculture. The Census of Agriculture is taken every five years in years ending in two and seven. Information from the QCEW reports is used to make estimates for years following the Census year until the next Census.

Industry Projections

The industry projections in this publication were produced using the *Projection Suite* software, authorized by the U.S. Department of Labor and developed by the Utah Department of Workforce Services. The program allows the analyst to choose from a variety of predefined, generally accepted projection models including linear and multiple regression models and shift-share models. Independent variables that may be used in the regression models are time, national employment, state civilian labor force, plus a variety of other national and state variables. A final forecast is chosen based on established statistical methodology.

For some industry reporting, Industry Supersectors are used. NAICS codes for Supersectors are not published in the NAICS manual. They were developed for statistical reporting purposes, and are used for some industry data contained on the Data Analysis section of the Discover Arkansas website.

Occupational Projections

Occupational projections are produced by merging industries and occupations together into an industry-occupational matrix. This matrix is a table showing the occupational pattern of each industry (i.e., the ratios of employment by occupation in a specific industry). The statewide matrix is based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) survey and uses a Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) code for each occupation. It uses the May OES semiannual survey of the year that corresponds to the base year to establish the staffing patterns and is provided through the Estimates Delivery System (EDS), now the Local Employment and Wages Information System (LEWIS).

The occupational employment projections contained in this publication were created using the *Projection Suite* software, authorized by the U.S. Department of Labor and developed by the Utah Department of Workforce Services. The software applies occupational change factors to the projected patterns to form a projected matrix. Also, using national self-employment and unpaid family workers staffing patterns, the system generates base and projected employment for self-employed and unpaid family workers.

Data Limitations

The projections contained in this publication are estimates based on historical data. It is important not to rely on these projections as the actual employment numbers that will occur in 2024. While every attempt is made to incorporate current and future events, such as business closings, corporate layoffs, openings, and expansions, it is not possible to know everything that might happen. Events that would take place after the projection period or announcements concerning closings, layoffs, openings, and expansions known after projections were completed are not reflected in the forecasts. Also, legislative policy could cause employment to change. Events such as these will likely cause the actual employment numbers to vary significantly from these projections.

It is important to look at both net growth and percent growth when looking at projections. Generally, industries or occupations with small employment will have higher growth rates than those with larger employment, but these industries may only add a few employees over the projection period. Concerning occupational projections, it is important to look at both replacement and growth openings. Even if an occupation is in decline, it still may have openings to replace workers who leave the profession for various reasons.


State of Arkansas

Arkansas has 75 counties and 10 Local Workforce Development Areas. There are also six Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs). The MSAs are Little Rock/North Little Rock/Conway; Fayetteville/Springdale/Rogers, which includes McDonald County in Missouri; Pine Bluff; Hot Springs; Jonesboro; and Fort Smith, which includes Leflore and Sequoyah Counties in Oklahoma. Parts of two other MSAs are located in the state, but are based in other states. Crittenden County is part of the Memphis/West Memphis MSA, which is based in Tennessee, and Miller County is part of the Texarkana AR/TX MSA, which is based in Texas.

Arkansas is rich in natural resources. The state has many historical landmarks and state parks scattered throughout the state. This is one of the reasons why Arkansas is called the Natural State.

Educational opportunities in the state of Arkansas are numerous. Prospective students have a wide range of institutions from which to choose, ranging from two-year community and technical colleges to four-year universities. Students can also choose between public/state institutions and private or religious-based institutions. These schools offer a variety of programs, ranging from technical certificates and associate's degrees to graduate degrees. Arkansas also has a number of small institutions that focus on specific types of careers. With all these educational opportunities, an array of occupational careers is waiting for graduates.

Arkansas's population based on the state Census Data Center estimates was 2,966,835 as of July 1, 2014, which is an increase of 17,336 residents from the 2012 Population Estimate. The unemployment rate for annual 2014 was 6.1 percent.



Industry Outlook

Arkansas' industries are projected to add 130,085 new jobs over the 2014-2024 projection period. **Goods-Producing** industries are expected to add 10,546 new jobs while the **Services-Providing** industries should see the majority of the growth, with 109,870 new jobs being added. Self-Employed and Unpaid Family Workers could see 9,669 more jobs.

The Natural Resources and Mining supersector is expected to gain 498 jobs during the projection period. The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting sector should see the largest gains with 301 jobs over the projection period, but Logging is expected to lose 148 jobs or a loss of 7.13 percent, placing it on the Top 20 Declining Industries list. The Mining sector could see a net gain of 197 jobs, with *Support Activities for Mining* sustaining the sector with 409 new jobs as other Mining sectors are losing ground.

The **Construction** supersector is estimated to add 5,458 jobs during the projection period. The *Specialty Trade Contractors* subsector should see the largest growth with 4,081 new jobs over the 10-year period, with Building Equipment Contractors adding 2,703 of those jobs or a growth of 17.72 percent.

The **Manufacturing** supersector is expected to increase by 4,590 jobs by 2024. **Non-Durable Goods Manufacturing** could see 2,273 of these jobs and the *Food Manufacturing* subsector is the driving force behind the growth with a projected gain of 1,443. Animal Slaughtering and Processing is the top growing industry in **Manufacturing** with a growth of 1,277. Fruit and Vegetable Preserving and Specialty Food Manufacturing could lose the most jobs among Non-Durable Goods Industries with a loss of 319. Five industries among Non-Durable Goods Manufacturing are on the Top 20 Fastest Declining Industries list, each losing more than 10 percent of its workforce. The *Leather and Allied Product Manufacturing* subsector could see a decline by 24.27 percent by 2024.

Durable Goods Manufacturing is also expecting gains with 2,317 jobs expected over the next 10 years. The largest increase in jobs should be seen in the *Transportation Equipment Manufacturing* subsector, with 1,156 jobs anticipated overall, but no industry made the Top 20 Growing Industries or Top 20 Fastest Growing Industries lists. Durable Goods Manufacturing has a mixed outlook as *Household and Institutional Furniture & Kitchen Cabinet* Manufacturing is expected to lose the most jobs with 251 and *Cutlery and Handtool* Manufacturing could be the fastest declining industry in the state losing 37.76 percent of its workforce.

The **Trade**, **Transportation**, and **Utilities** supersector is projected to gain 21,004 jobs over the 10-year period. Wholesale **Trade** could see an increase of 4,897 jobs with the *Wholesale Electronic Markets and Agents and Brokers* adding the most with 2,586 new jobs, an increase of 25.09 percent making both the Top 20 Growing Industries and Top 20 Fastest Growing Industries lists. **Retail Trade** could increase by 10,995 jobs over the projection period. **Retail Trade** will likely see growth in every subsector. The largest increase could come in *General Merchandise Stores* with 5,286, about 48 percent of the sector's growth.

Transportation and Warehousing is projected to add 5,000 jobs. *Truck Transportation* should increase by 3,508 jobs with General Freight Trucking adding 2,602 of those jobs, placing it on the Top 20 Growing Industries list. *Support Activities for Rail Transportation* is estimated to be the fastest growing industry in the state increasing by 91.15 percent between 2014 and 2024. **Utilities** is expected to experience a net gain of 112 jobs by 2024, but an anticipated loss of 168 jobs in Natural Gas Distribution will be offset by gains in Electric Power Generation, Transmission and Distribution and Water, Sewage and Other Systems with 68 and 212 jobs respectively.

The **Information** supersector could lose 399 jobs during the projection period. The *Telecommunications* subsector could see a significant net loss of 571 jobs over the projections period, with 577 jobs lost in Wired Telecommunications Carriers. Newspaper, Periodical, Book, and Directory Publishers, of the *Publishing Industries (except Internet)* subsector, could see a loss of 149 jobs, a decline of 4.74 percent. Both industries place on the Top 20 Declining Industries list.

The **Financial Activities** supersector is projected to add 3,922 new jobs, with the **Finance and Insurance** sector accounting for 2,450 of those new jobs. Agencies, Brokerages, and Other Insurance Related Activities is expected to add 863 new jobs by 2024. Activities Related to Credit Intermediation should see a 15.67 percent growth over the projection period. The **Real Estate and Rental and Leasing** sector is predicted to increase by 1,472 jobs. More than half of those jobs could come in Activities Related to Real Estate, which is forecast to gain 789, an increase of 26.81 percent, placing it in the Top 20 Fastest Growing Industries list.


The **Professional and Business Services** supersector is expected to add 15,106 jobs by 2024. The **Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services** sector could see the largest growth with 7,090 new jobs. Employment Services should see the most growth with an estimated 3,683 new jobs, placing it among the top 5 in the Top 20 Growing Industries list. **Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services** should anticipate 5,307 jobs over the projection period. Computer Systems Design and Related Services is estimated to gain 2,018 of those jobs. **Management of Companies and Enterprises** could see an increase of 2,709.

Education and Health Services is projected to be the top growing supersector in the state, with 38,712 new jobs being added by 2024. *Educational Services* could see a growth of 8,129 jobs. Colleges, Universities, and Professional Schools should see most of this growth with 3,444 jobs added. Health Care and Social Assistance could see the largest growth among industry sectors with 30,583 jobs expected. Of those jobs, 14,186 should be found in the *Ambulatory Health Care Services*. In all, nine industries in Education and Health Services made the Top 20 Growing Industries list and nine industries made the Top 20 Fastest Growing Industries list.

The Leisure and Hospitality supersector is expected to add 19,226 jobs during the projection period. At 17.85 percent, the supersector is projected to be the fastest growing. Accommodation and Food Services should lead the supersector with 18,377 new jobs projected and be the fastest growing sector in the state at 18.89 percent. The majority of these jobs could be found in *Food Services and Drinking Places*, with 17,579 jobs expected. Restaurants and Other Eating Places will see the most growth with 17,361 jobs, placing the industry at the top of the Top 20 Growing Industries list. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation could see 849 new jobs over the projection period, with no losses expected in any of the sectors.

The **Other Services (Except Government)** supersector could add 3,827 new jobs by 2024. *Religious, Grantmaking, Civic, Professional, and Similar Organizations* could lead the supersector with 2,776 jobs. Personal Care Services could see 295 of the 320 new jobs found in the *Personal and Laundry Services* sector. Business, Professional, Labor, Political, and Similar Organizations could see the most loss with 311 between 2014 and 2024.

The **Government** supersector is projected to grow by 8,472 jobs during the 10-year period. *State, Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals* should see 3,634 new jobs, while *Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals* could see a growth of 4,681 new jobs, placing both on the Top 20 Growing Industries list. Postal Service should see a decrease of 676 jobs by 2024 as small short-term gains likely will not be enough to offset long-term losses. Federal Government, Excluding Post Office is expected to gain 833.

Occupational Outlook

Arkansas occupations are projected to gain 130,085 jobs, or 9.91 percent, by 2024. A total of 44,240 total annual openings are expected each year of the projection period. Of these, 13,551 will be due to growth and 30,689 will be due to replacement. All major groups should see positive growth over the 10-year projection period.

The **Management Occupations** major group is expected to gain 11,226 jobs during the projection period, with 3,557 total annual job openings. Of these, 1,126 will be due to growth and 2,431 will be due to replacement. *Other Management Occupations* occupational family is estimated to account for 7,158 new jobs with Farmers, Ranchers, and Other Agricultural Managers driving this growth with a gain of 4,325. Computer and Information Systems Managers is predicted to increase by 20.21 percent.

The **Business and Financial Operations Occupations** major group is projected to gain 5,534 jobs by 2024. The group should see 1,523 annual job openings with 561 due to annual growth and 962 due to annual replacement. Of this group, the *Business Operations Specialists* minor group is expecting the largest net growth with 3,662 jobs. Accountants and Auditors is estimated to add the most jobs among the main occupations in the *Financial Specialists* occupational family, while Personal Financial Advisors could see a 25.70 percent increase in jobs. Labor Relations Specialists could see the worst outlook with a loss of 55 jobs, or 8.33 percent of its workforce.

The **Computer and Mathematical Occupations** major group is expected to add 2,939 jobs during the projection period, or 13.31 percent. Total Annual Openings could see 657 jobs with 314 annual openings due to growth and 343 annual openings due to replacement, the smallest gap between growth and replacement openings in the major groups. The *Computer Occupations* minor group should see most of this growth with 2,734 jobs expected over the 10-year period. Computer Systems Analysts is estimated to add the most jobs with a gain of 663. Statisticians, of the *Mathematical Science Occupations* occupational family, is set to be the fastest growing occupation in **Computer and Mathematical Occupations** with a growth of 34.42 percent. Computer Programmers, however, are not seeing as favorable of an outlook, with an estimated loss of 206 jobs, or 5.88 percent of its workforce.

The Architecture and Engineering Occupations major group could add 800 jobs by 2024. The group is expected to have 380 total annual openings with 83 annual openings due to growth and 297 annual openings due to replacement. The *Engineers* minor group leads the group in net growth, expecting to add 620 jobs during the projection period. In this minor group, Mechanical Engineers could add 138 jobs or a 10.75 percent growth by 2024.

The Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations major group is predicted to gain 843 jobs through the projection period, or 11.27 percent. Annual openings due to replacement should account for 225 of the 309 total annual openings. The *Life, Physical, and Social Science Technicians* minor group is expected to gain 320 jobs. Clinical, Counseling, and School Psychologists is projected to add the most jobs in the major group with an increase of 120, while Forensic Science Technicians could be the fastest growing occupation with a gain of 32.67 percent.

The **Community and Social Services Occupations** major group is estimated to gain 4,235 jobs during the projection period. The group could see 424 annual openings due to growth and 554 annual openings due to replacement. Clergy, of the *Religious Workers* minor group, leads the major group with 1,377 jobs expected, of which, 105 annual job openings will be due to growth. Substance Abuse and Behavioral Disorder Counselors is expected to grow by 33.04 percent, placing it among the 10 fastest growing occupations in the state.

The Legal Occupations major group is projected to add 980 jobs by 2024. Of the 239 annual openings, 98 should be due to growth and 141 should be due to replacement. The *Lawyers, Judges, and Related Workers* minor group leads the group with 717 new jobs anticipated, with Lawyers accounting for 642 of those new jobs. The *Legal Support Workers* minor group also expects strong growth with 263 jobs projected to be added. Paralegals and Legal Assistants leads this minor group with 213 jobs expected.

The Education, Training, and Library Occupations major group is expected to gain 6,114 jobs during the projection period. The group could see 2,074 total annual openings with annual openings due to growth and annual openings due to replacement contributing 612 and 1,462 openings, respectively. The *Postsecondary Teachers* is expected to add 2,453 jobs, while *Preschool, Primary, Secondary, and Special Education School Teachers* minor group is predicted to increase by 1,971 jobs. Teaching Assistants is anticipated to lead all jobs in the major group adding 628 new jobs between 2014 and 2024. Criminal Justice and Law Enforcement Teachers, Postsecondary is predicted to be the fastest growing occupation in the major group with a growth rate of 29.41 percent and placing in the Top 20 Fastest Growing Occupations list.

The Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations major group is projected to add 842 jobs by 2024. Of the 408 total annual openings, 315 of them should be due to replacement. The *Entertainers and Performers, Sports and Related Workers* minor group leads the group with 281 job openings projected. Public Relations Specialists is

projected to be the top growing occupation gaining 116 new jobs during the projection period. Film and Video Editors could increase staffing by 27.18 percent, while Radio and Television Announcers could lose 14.32 percent.

The Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations major group is estimated to add 11,983 jobs by the end of the projection period. This group could see 2,865 annual job openings with 1,203 due to growth and expansion and 1,662 for replacement. Driving growth is Registered Nurses, which is predicted to see continued growth with 3,415 jobs expected placing among the top five in the Top 20 Growing Occupations list. Six occupations in this major group are in the Top 20 Fastest Growing Occupations list with Physician Assistants leading with an anticipated increase of 38.26 percent. Licensed Practical and Licensed Vocational Nurses, of the *Health Technologists and Technicians* occupations in Total Annual Openings with 866 and 465 jobs, respectively.

The **Healthcare Support Occupations** major group is projected to add 6,652 jobs by 2024. The group should see 1,515 total annual openings with 846 of the jobs due to replacement. At a growth of 17.68 percent, the major group is estimated to be the fastest growing in the state. Driving this growth are the top three fastest growing occupations, all related to therapy. Occupational Therapy Assistants is expected to be the fastest growing occupation in the state increasing by 53.55 percent. Physical Therapy Aides and Physical Therapy Assistants are anticipating growths of 44.55 and 41.76 percent, respectively. Nursing Assistants is expected to lead the *Nursing, Psychiatric, and Home Health Aides* minor group and **Healthcare Support Occupations**, as a whole, with 2,804 jobs in net growth and placing it among the 10 highest growing occupations.

The **Protective Service Occupations** major group is expected to add 2,893 jobs over the projection period with 946 total annual openings. Of these, 655 annual openings will be due to replacement and 291 due to growth. The *Law Enforcement Workers* minor group leads the group with 1,416 new jobs anticipated, with 590 jobs in Correctional Officers and Jailers and 746 jobs in Police and Sheriff's Patrol Officers expected.

The **Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations** major group is estimated to add 17,641 jobs during the projection period, making it the largest net growth of all the major groups. Of the 5,319 annual job openings, 3,524 should be due to replacement and 1,795 jobs for growth. The *Food and Beverage Serving Workers* minor group leads the group with 10,416 jobs expected, with Combined Food Preparation and Serving Workers, Including Fast Food and Waiters and Waiterses contributing 6,137 and 3,299 of those new jobs, respectively. Combined Food Preparation and Serving Workers, Including Fast Food is estimated to be the top growing occupation in the state, while Waiters and Waiterses and Cooks, Restaurant both fall on the Top 20 Growing Occupations list. On the negative side, Cooks, Fast Food could see a loss of 311.

The **Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations** major group is projected to add 3,344 jobs by 2024. The group should have 1,190 total annual openings with 855 jobs due to replacement and 335 jobs due to growth. The *Building Cleaning and Pest Control Workers* minor group is expected to add 2,348 jobs with Janitors and Cleaners, Except Maids and Housekeeping Cleaners estimated to add 1,571 of those jobs. This occupation also falls in the Top 20 Occupations by Total Annual Openings list.

The **Personal Care and Service Occupations** major group is expected to gain 5,624 jobs over the projection period. Of the 1,450 total annual openings, 564 should be due to growth and 886 due to replacement. The *Other Personal Care and Service Workers* minor group leads the major group with 4,695 new jobs expected, about 83.48 percent of the total growth in **Personal Care and Service Occupations**. Personal Care Aides is predicted to add 2,845 jobs to this minor group and 417 total job openings expected annually with growth openings exceeding replacement openings by the largest margin. It is among the 10 highest growing occupations in the state. Childcare Workers is also anticipating strong growth with 1,368 new jobs.

The **Sales and Related Occupations** major group is projected to gain 12,752 jobs by the end of 2024. The group is estimated to make available 5,329 jobs annually, the most of all major groups. Of these, 4,048 openings would be due to replacement and 1,281 openings due to growth. The *Retail Sales Workers* minor group is expected to gain 7,402 jobs over the 10-year period. Retail Salespersons will likely make up most of the net growth with 5,179 jobs expected, placing it second in the state in net growth and the top occupation in number of annual openings with 1,902. In all, four occupations in the **Sales and Related Occupations** major group made the Top 20 Growing Occupations list.

The **Office and Administrative Support Occupations** major group is expected to gain 11,011 jobs over the projection period. Annual openings for this group are estimated to be 5,244 with 3,906 openings due to replacement and 1,338 openings due to growth. The *Information and Record Clerks* minor group should see the most growth with 4,316 jobs added. Customer Service Representatives could see the most growth in this minor group, with 2,468 jobs added by 2024 placing among the 10 highest growing occupations. Office Clerks, General could add an additional 2,396 jobs. Medical Secretaries could be the fastest growing occupation with an 18.18 percent rise in jobs. However, on the negative side of the economy, Bookkeeping, Accounting, and Auditing Clerks is predicted to be the top declining occupation in the state with a loss of 739 jobs. In all, eight occupations make the Top 20 Declining Occupations list. Postal Service Mail Sorters, Processors, and Processing Machine Operators could be the third fastest declining occupation with a decline rate of 20.29 percent.

The **Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations** major group is estimated to be the slowest among the major groups adding only 172 jobs by 2024. The major group is predicting 298 annual openings due to replacement and 31 annual openings due to growth. The *Agricultural Workers* minor group could add 133 jobs while the *Forest, Conservation, and Logging Workers* minor group could see a gain of 51 jobs. Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse is predicted to add the most jobs with 92 new jobs, while Agricultural Equipment Operators could be the fastest growing occupation increasing by 10.78 percent. Most of the job losses could be in Fallers, which is expected to lose 47 jobs, or 11.24 percent of its workforce.

The **Construction and Extraction Occupations** major group is projected to gain 5,711 jobs over the projection period, with 1,421 total annual openings expected. The group is expected to have 848 annual openings due to replacement and 573 annual openings due to growth. The *Construction Trades Workers* minor group is expected to see a large gain with 4,305 jobs expected, more than three out of four jobs in the major group. Construction Laborers could add the most jobs with 1,132 anticipated, while Insulation Workers, Mechanical should see an increase of 29.53 percent, placing it on the Top 20 Fastest Growing Occupations by Percent Growth list.

The **Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations** major group is expected to gain 5,154 jobs by 2024. The major group is estimated to have 1,815 total annual openings with 1,274 due to replacement and 541 due to growth. The *Other Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations* minor group could lead the group with 3,371 jobs projected, with the Maintenance and Repair Workers, General adding 1,189 jobs and Industrial Machinery Mechanics expecting to add 1,138. Rail Car Repairers could see an increase of 30.41 percent. Telecommunications Equipment Installers and Repairers, Except Line Installers could see a reduction of 132 jobs, or 7.55 percent of its workforce.

The **Production Occupations** major group is projected to add 4,048 jobs between 2014 and 2024. The group is expected to experience 2,624 annual openings due to replacement and 573 annual openings due to growth. The *Other Production Occupations* minor group leads the group with 1,387 jobs expected. Inspectors, Testers, Sorters, Samplers, and Weighers could see 306 of those new jobs. Team Assemblers is estimated to lead the major group in net growth with 880 new jobs, while Computer Numerically Controlled Machine Tool Programmers, Metal and Plastic is projected to be the fastest growing occupation with a 28.83 percent growth. On the negative side of the economy, Cutting, Punching, and Press Machine Setters, Operators, and Tenders, Metal and Plastic is forecast to be second in the state in decline with a loss of 372. Photographic Process Workers and Processing Machine Operators is predicted to be the fastest declining occupation in the state with a decline of 22.89 percent. In all, 14 occupations in this major group are included on the Top 20 Fastest Declining Occupations list.

The **Transportation and Material Moving Occupations** major group is estimated to gain 9,587 jobs during the projection period. With 3,495 total annual openings expected, 2,533 should be due to replacement and 962 due to growth. Heavy and Tractor Trailer - Truck Drivers leads the group with 3,890 new jobs, fourth in the state. Laborers and Freight, Stock, and Material Movers, Hand is estimated to add an additional 2,213. Ambulance Drivers and Attendants, Except Emergency Medical Technicians is projected to increase 25.29 percent over the next 10 years.

Introduction to New Education/Work Experience/Training Classification

The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes information on occupational employment projections and related career information. This includes the education and training needs for each occupation. Under the old system, 11 categories were assigned ranging from Professional Degree to Short-Term On-the-Job Training. Each occupation was assigned a training that best matched the "most significant source" of education or training. In other words, the education or training assigned to the occupation is what most people used for entry into the occupation. However, what has been discovered over the last few years is that many occupations require more than just postsecondary education. Many require work experience and some require On-the-Job training in addition to formal training.

This is why the Bureau of Labor Statistics introduced a new education and training classification. The new system now has three education/training classifications. The Education Category is the education that is typically needed to enter the occupation. Professional Degree and Doctoral Degree have merged, while most of the standard degrees have been retained. Three new categories have been added (Some College, No Degree; High School Diploma or Equivalent; and No Formal Education Required). Work Experience and On-the-Job Training have been broken out into two separate categories. Work Experience ranges from None to More than 5 Years. Along with the three standard On-the-Job Training categories from the Old System (Long-Term, Moderate-Term, Short-Term), Internship/Residency and Apprenticeship have been added along with None. The following pages will provide the outlook for each of the three training classification categories. Refer to Page 83 for definitions of the Education/Training Classifications.

Education Outlook


Occupations requiring a Bachelor's Degree are likely to add 24,618 jobs during the projection period, but occupations that require a High School Diploma or Equivalent will have more annual job openings than any other education level, with 15,899 jobs expected each year. Jobs requiring Postsecondary Non-Degree Awards are estimated to add 12,461 jobs into the workforce. Job seekers with at least an Associate's Degree could see 10,046 annual job openings when they are ready to enter the workforce.

Jobs requiring a Master's Degree could see the largest percent growth, with 16.83 percent growth over the 10-year period, with occupations requiring a Doctoral or Professional Degree following close behind with a 16.72 percent growth expected.



2014-2024 Occupational Projections by Work Experience

Many occupations require experience beyond formal educational training, but most do not. Occupations requiring no experience beyond formal education are projected to add the most jobs, with an expected 104,474 jobs added over the 10year period. These occupations are also expected to see 36,844 total annual job openings over the projection period. For occupations requiring less than 5 years of experience, 16,488 new jobs are expected over the projections period, with 4,533 total annual openings expected. Occupations with 5 years or more experience needed should see a net growth of 9,123 openings over the projection period, with 2,849 annual openings over the 10-year period.



Even with a formal education, many occupations require specialized on-the-job training before a person is fully viable in an occupation. All of the on-the-job training categories should see positive growth. Apprenticeship will see the largest percent growth of 12.51 percent, and should have 504 total annual openings. Occupations requiring short-term on-the-job training will see the largest net growth with 50,522 expected jobs over the projection period and should see the largest number of Total Annual Openings with 19,617 jobs expected.
