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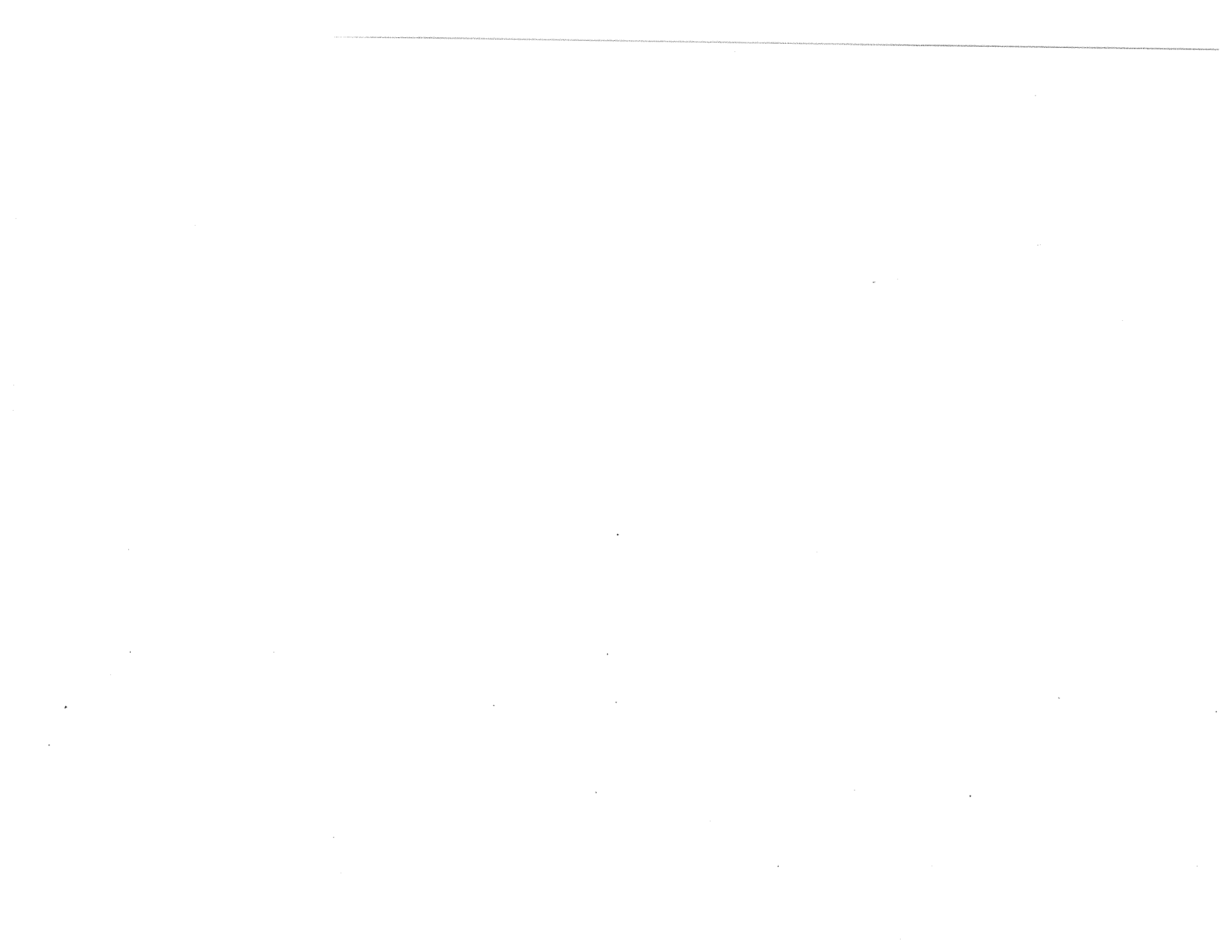
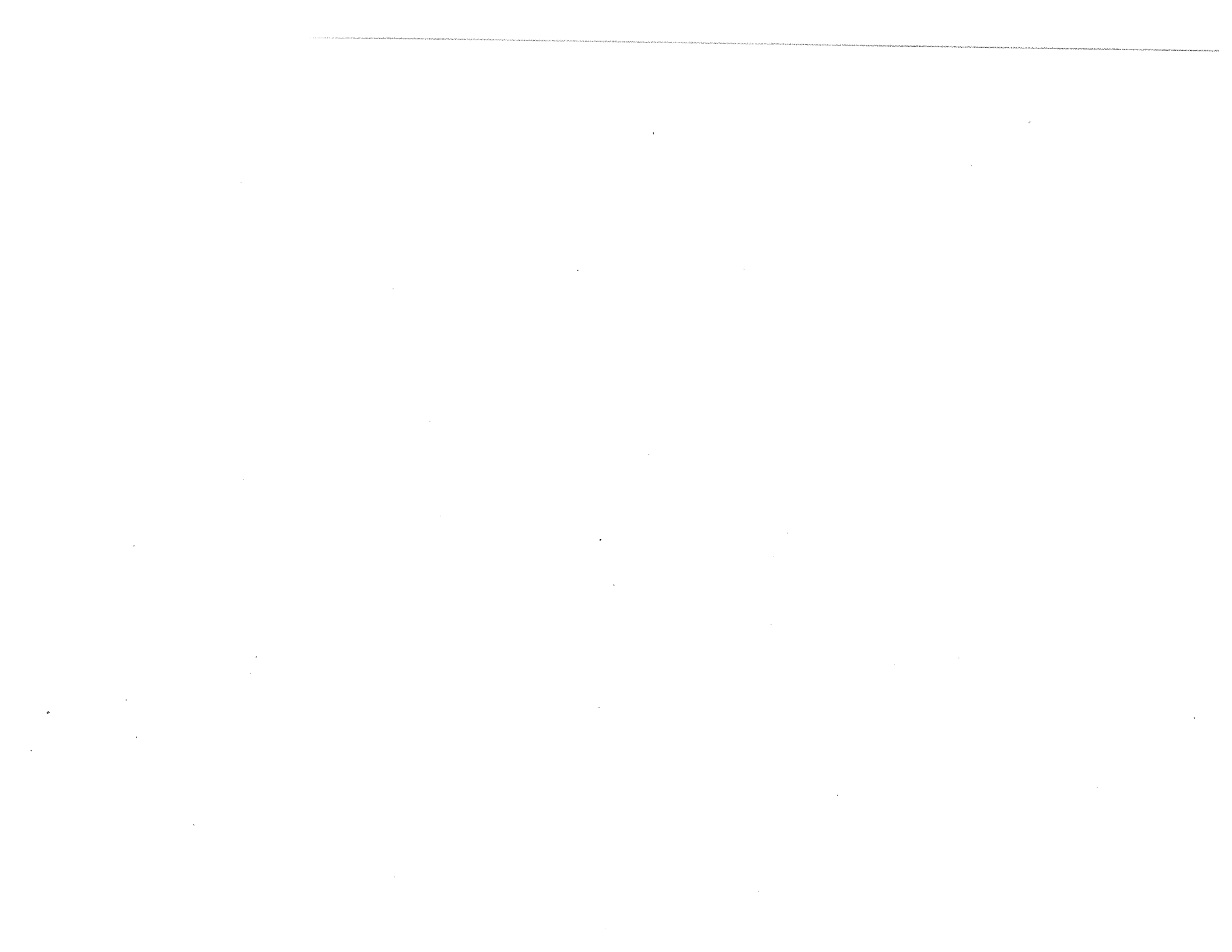


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**EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS
UNDER THE ARKANSAS EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW
FIRST QUARTER 1990**

DESCRIPTION OF DATA

This publication contains covered employment and payroll data by industry and county for the **First Quarter 1990**. These data are compiled from quarterly contribution and wage reports submitted by employers subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law. Employment data have been tabulated for each month of the quarter by industry under the Revised SIC Classification (**see "Industry Classification" below**) on a statewide and county basis. Payroll data represent the total wages paid during the quarter and are also shown by industry for the State and by publishable industry groups for each county. In addition, there are tables included which set out total covered employment and manufacturing employment by months, quarterly payrolls, and average weekly earnings for the years 1984 through 1990.

INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION

Previously published industry data will not be comparable in all instances with currently published data since industry codes have been revised according to the following Manuals: (a) manufacturing industries were coded according to the 1945 Standard Industrial Manual until December 31, 1957, while nonmanufacturing industries were coded under the Social Security Board Industrial Classification Manual (1942), (b) between January 1, 1958 and December 31, 1967, industry codes were assigned under the 1957 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual, (c) between January 1, 1968 and December 31, 1974, industry codes were assigned under the 1967 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual, (d) between January 1, 1975 and December 31, 1987, industry codes were assigned under the 1972 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual, and (e) since January 1, 1988, industry codes have been assigned under the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual.

DEFINITION OF COVERED EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS

Covered employment is the number of workers employed by employers subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law during the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. An employer is subject to the law when he has employed one or more employees in each of ten days during the current or preceding calendar year.

Currently excluded from coverage is employment covered by the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act; some domestic service workers; employees of small agricultural establishments, self-employed and unpaid family workers; insurance and real estate agents who are on commission only, and employees of churches and religious organizations, except separately incorporated schools. The payroll information in this publication includes all wages and salaries paid to covered employees by their employers including bonuses, commissions, and cash values or remunerations received in any medium other than cash. These wages include both taxable and nontaxable wages. Only the first \$7,800 paid to each worker by an employer in the calendar year is taxable under the Arkansas Employment Security Law.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

The table on **page 50** lists the total number of civilians employed by the Federal Government in Arkansas during the **First Quarter 1990**. Employment relating to selected Federal departments is also set out. These data are obtained from required reports submitted by various government agencies having employment in the State.

COUNTY CLASSIFICATION

Employment and payroll data by county are classified according to the county where the workers are employed. Employers with operations in more than one county are requested to furnish this agency with a breakdown of employment and wages for at least one quarter of each year by the counties in which they operate. Many such employers submit county data with each regular contribution report. This information is invaluable in the preparation of monthly employment and payroll data by county. Employment and payroll data for multi-area employers who do not furnish county data each quarter of the year are prorated by county on the basis of the one quarter's information.

The "rest-of-state" table which appears on **page 49** of this publication includes data for firms which did not provide a county breakdown of employment and payrolls. It also includes sales and other type personnel with no permanent place of work as well as employment of employers with no established place of business in Arkansas.

SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS DURING FIRST QUARTER 1990

AVERAGE EMPLOYMENT CHANGES

Covered employment averaged 861,379 during the **First Quarter 1990**, a decrease of 9,154 over the previous quarter and an increase of 28,804 over the average recorded one year ago. Both manufacturing and nonmanufacturing industries experienced over-the-quarter decreases of 1,338 and 7,816, respectively. Both sectors, however, experienced over-the-year increases. The manufacturing industries added 2,132, while the nonmanufacturing industries increased 26,672.

EMPLOYMENT CHANGES FROM FOURTH QUARTER 1989

Over-the-quarter losses were recorded in twelve of the published manufacturing industry groups, while seven experienced gains. The most significant declines occurred in lumber and wood products (-528), transportation equipment (-491), and electronic and other electric equipment (-398). Fabricated metal products recorded the greatest gain (+474), followed by petroleum and coal products (+250).

The only gains in nonmanufacturing industries occurred in state and local government (+1,655) and services (+799). Significant losses were recorded in wholesale and retail trade (-5,303), construction (-2,341) and agriculture, forestry and fishing (-1,382). Losses in wholesale and retail trade were due to the layoff of extra employees hired during the Christmas season.

Changes in employment levels occurred in some industry groups as the result of industry reclassifications effective January 1, 1990.

EMPLOYMENT CHANGES FROM FIRST QUARTER 1989 ¹

The most significant over-the-year gain in manufacturing occurred in food and kindred products (+2,995). Losses were recorded in electronic and other electric equipment (-976), transportation equipment (-677), instruments and related products (-433), and lumber and wood products (-410).

All nonmanufacturing industry groups registered over-the-year gains except finance, insurance and real estate (-171). The most significant gains occurred in services (+11,012), construction (+5,273), and state and local government (+4,655).

COVERED WAGES

Wages paid to covered workers totaled \$3,744,269,232 for the **First Quarter 1990** for an average weekly wage of \$334.37. Workers in the manufacturing industries earned an average weekly wage of \$383.11. Employees in the paper and allied products industry received the highest average weekly wage (\$593.00), while workers in apparel and other textile products earned the lowest (\$194.27). Average weekly earnings for nonmanufacturing workers was \$316.69.

Little River County employees recorded the highest average weekly wage (\$468.12) and workers in Searcy County the lowest (\$205.43).

TOTAL COVERED AND MANUFACTURING EMPLOYMENT

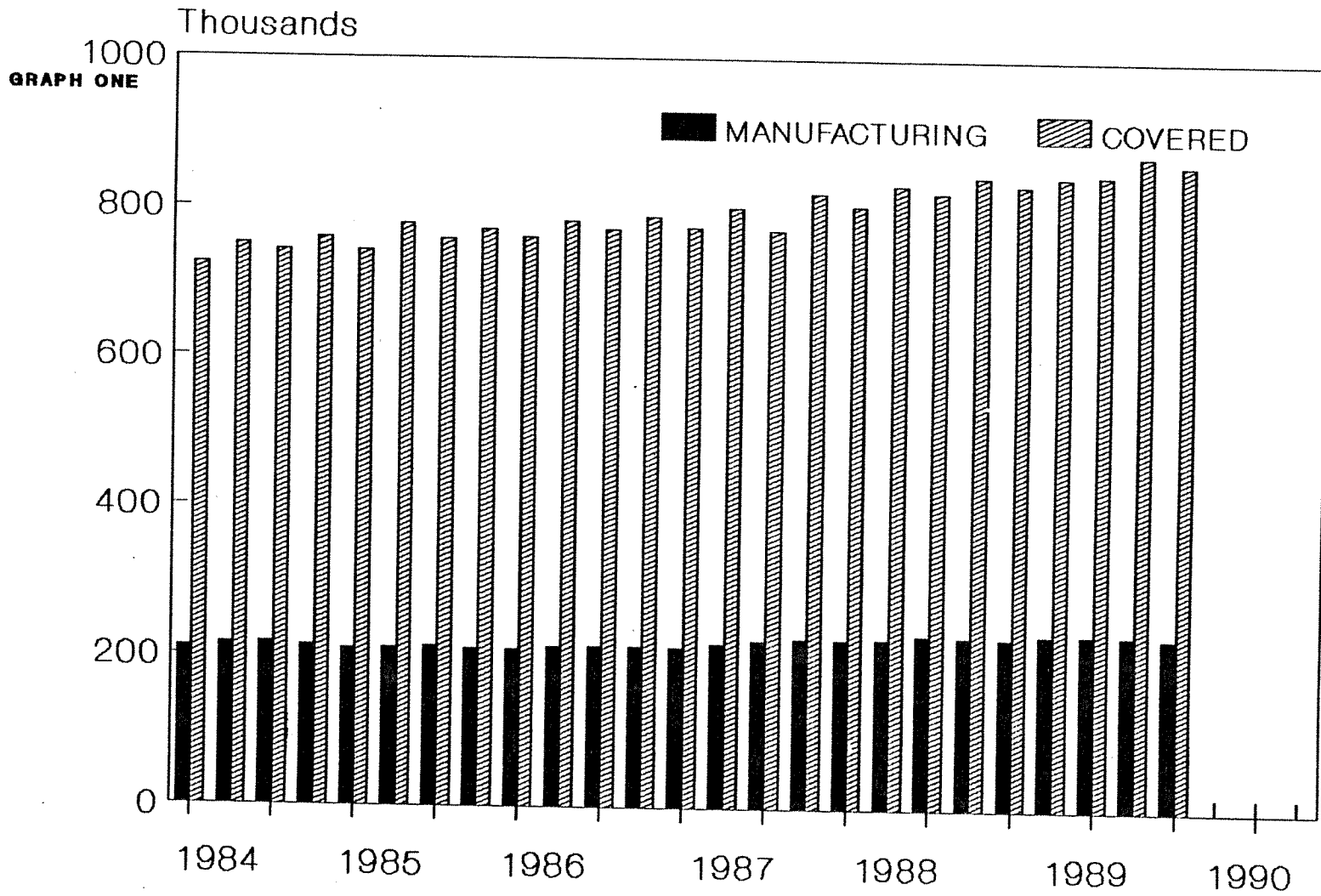

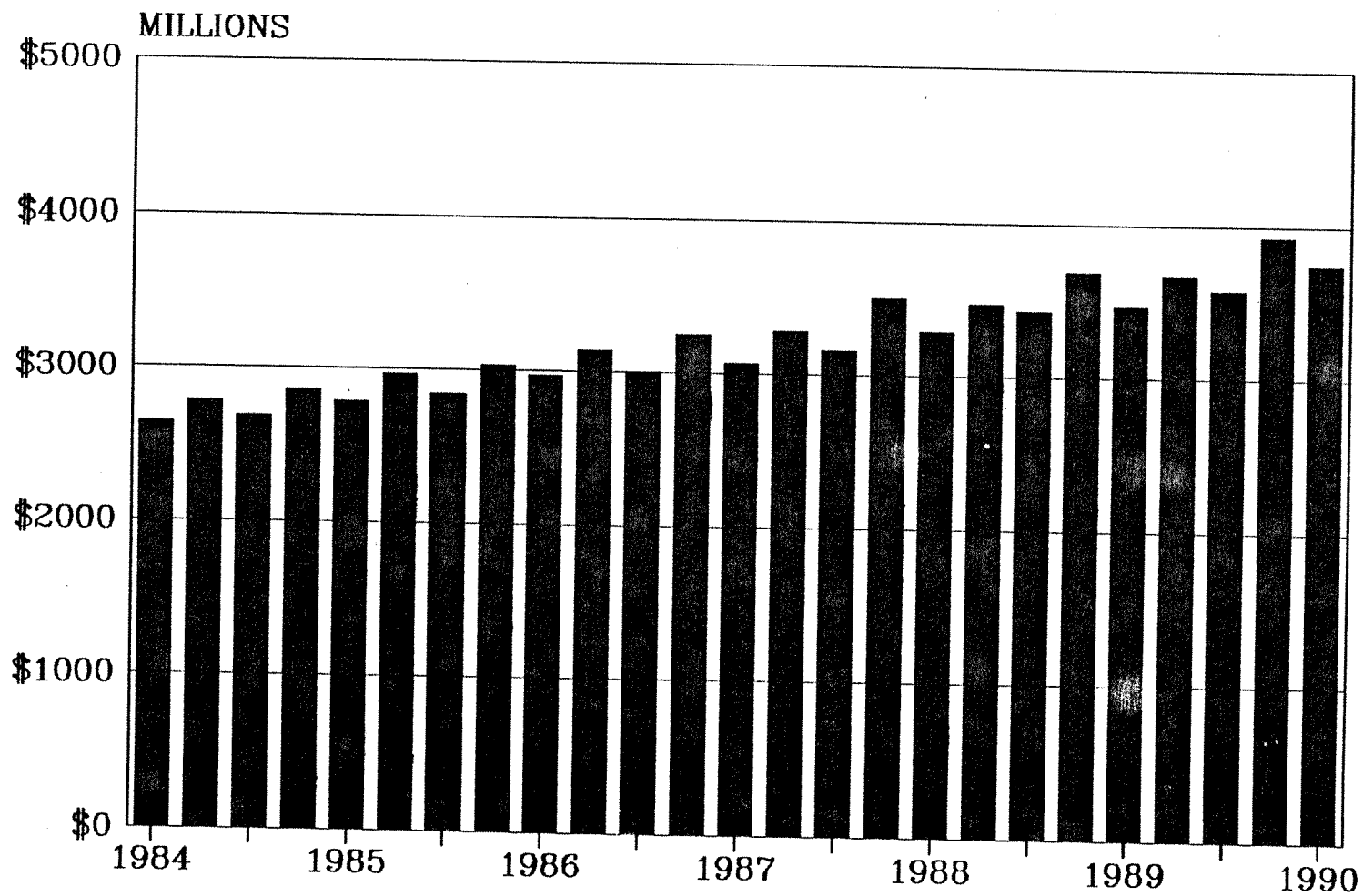
