**DESCRIPTION OF DATA**

This publication contains covered employment and payroll data by industry and county for the Fourth Quarter 2000. These data are compiled from quarterly contribution and wage reports submitted by employers subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law. An employing unit is a single physical location where business is conducted, production takes place, or services are provided. Employment data have been tabulated for each month of the quarter by industry under the Revised SIC Classification (see "Industry Classification" below) on a statewide and county basis. Payroll data represent the total wages paid during the quarter and are also shown by industry for the State and by publishable industry groups for each

county. The tabulation of this data is a joint effort in conjunction with the Bureau of Labor Statistics. In addition, there are tables included which set out total covered employment and manufacturing employment by months, quarterly payrolls, and average weekly earnings for the years 1994 through 2000. Data contained in this publication are subject to revision. These revisions will be reflected in the 2000 Annual Covered Employment and Earnings publication. Because of industry code changes between years, there may be substantial employment and wage shifts among industries.

**INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION**

Previously published industry data will not be comparable in all instances with currently published data since industry codes have been revised according to the following Manuals: (a) manufacturing industries were coded according to the 1945 Standard Industrial Manual until December 31, 1957, while nonmanufacturing industries were coded under the Social Security Board Industrial Classification Manual (1942); (b) between January 1, 1958 and December 31, 1967, industry codes were assigned under the 1957 Standard

Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual; (c) between January 1, 1968 and December 31, 1974, industry codes were assigned under the 1967 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual; (d) between January 1, 1975 and December 31, 1987, industry codes were assigned under the 1972 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual; and (e) since January 1, 1988, industry codes have been assigned under the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual.

## **DEFINITION OF COVERED EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS**

Covered Employment is the number of workers employed by employers subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law who worked or received pay for the payroll period which includes the 12th of the month. An employer is subject to the law when he has employed one or more employees in each of ten days during the current or preceding calendar year.

Currently excluded from coverage is employment covered by the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act; some domestic service workers; employees of small agricultural establishments; self-employed and unpaid family workers; insurance and real estate

agents who are on commission only; and employees of churches and religious organizations, except separately incorporated schools. The payroll information in this publication includes all wages and salaries paid to covered employees by their employers including bonuses, commissions, and cash values of remuneration received in any medium other than cash. These wages include both taxable and nontaxable wages. Only the first \$9,000 paid to each worker by an employer in the calendar year is taxable under the Arkansas Employment Security Law.

## **FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT**

The table on page 53 lists the total number of civilians employed by the Federal Government in Arkansas during the Fourth Quarter 2000. Employment and wage data are set out by industry divisions. These data are obtained from required reports submitted by various

government agencies having employment in the State. Civilian Federal workers are covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program.

## **COUNTY CLASSIFICATION**

Employment and payroll data by county are classified according to the county where the workers are employed. Employers with operations in more than one county are requested to furnish this agency with a breakdown of employment and wages for at least one quarter of each year by the counties in which they operate. Many such employers submit county data with each regular contribution report. This information is invaluable in the preparation of monthly employment and payroll data by county. Employment and payroll data for multi-area employers who do not furnish county data each

quarter of the year are prorated by county on the basis of one quarter's information.

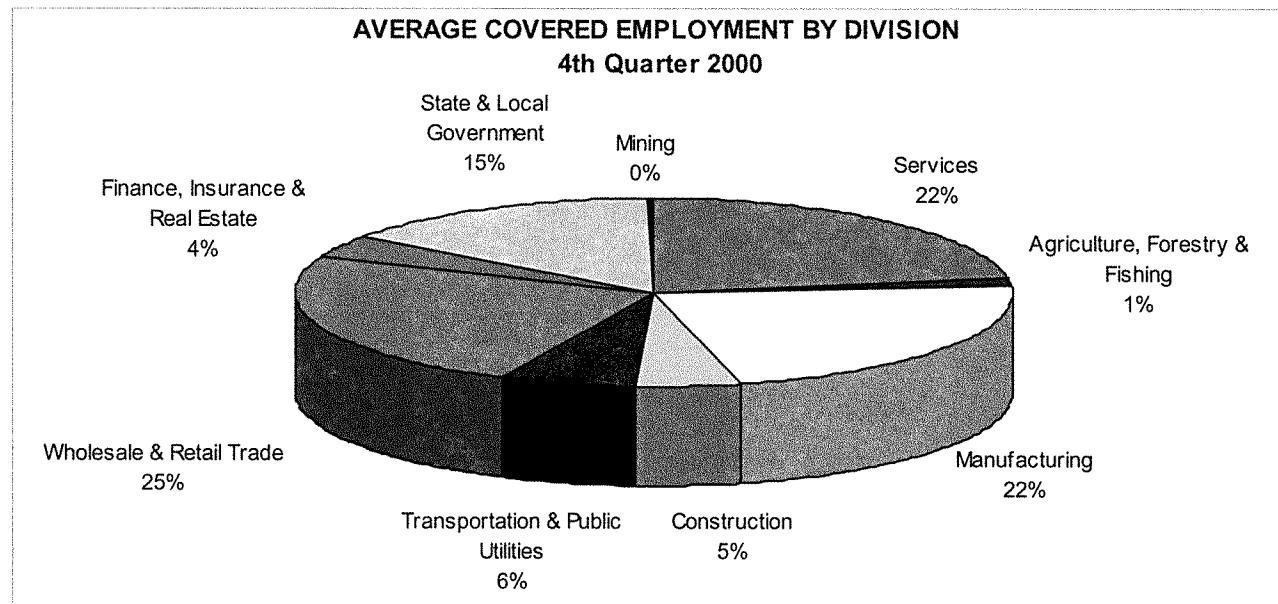
The "rest-of-state" table which appears on page 52 of this publication includes data for firms which did not provide a county breakdown of employment and payrolls. It also includes sales and other type personnel with no permanent place of work, as well as employment of employers with no established place of business in Arkansas.

## SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS DURING FOURTH QUARTER 2000

### AVERAGE EMPLOYMENT CHANGES

Covered employment averaged 1,120,168 during the Fourth Quarter 2000, an increase of 21,910 from the previous quarter and 7,634 above the average recorded one year ago. Manufacturing industries experienced an over-the-quarter decrease of 2,342 while

nonmanufacturing industries recorded an increase of 24,252. Manufacturing industries declined by 2,980 from the average recorded one year ago while nonmanufacturing industries added 10,614.



### EMPLOYMENT CHANGES FROM THIRD QUARTER 2000

Over-the-quarter gains were recorded in six of the published manufacturing industry groups, while thirteen experienced losses. The most significant gains occurred in food and kindred products (+346), printing and publishing (+160), and leather and leather products (+157). Notable losses were recorded in lumber and wood products (-708), fabricated metal products (-516), and transportation equipment (-439).

Nonmanufacturing industry groups recording significant over-the-quarter gains were state and local government (+27,183), wholesale and retail trade (+1,722), and transportation and public utilities (+1,158). The most significant losses occurred in services (-3,374), construction (-1,640), and agriculture, forestry, and fishing (-583).

## EMPLOYMENT CHANGES FROM FOURTH QUARTER 1999

The most significant over-the-year gains in manufacturing industries occurred in transportation equipment (+475), printing and publishing (+423), and rubber and miscellaneous plastics products (+278). Notable losses were recorded in lumber and wood products (-1,087), food and kindred products (-946), and furniture and fixtures (-851).

Significant over-the-year gains in nonmanufacturing industry groups occurred in wholesale and retail trade (+3,088), state and local government (+2,629), and construction (+2,035).

## COVERED WAGES

Wages paid to covered workers totaled \$7,565,573,643, for the Fourth Quarter 2000, for an average weekly wage of \$519.54. Workers in the manufacturing industries earned an average weekly wage of \$580.69. Employees in the chemicals and allied products industry received the highest average weekly wage (\$862.21), while workers in apparel and other textile products earned the lowest

(\$320.12). Workers in nonmanufacturing industries earned an average weekly wage of \$502.04.

Little River County employees recorded the highest average weekly wage (\$633.49) and workers in Newton County the lowest (\$303.95).

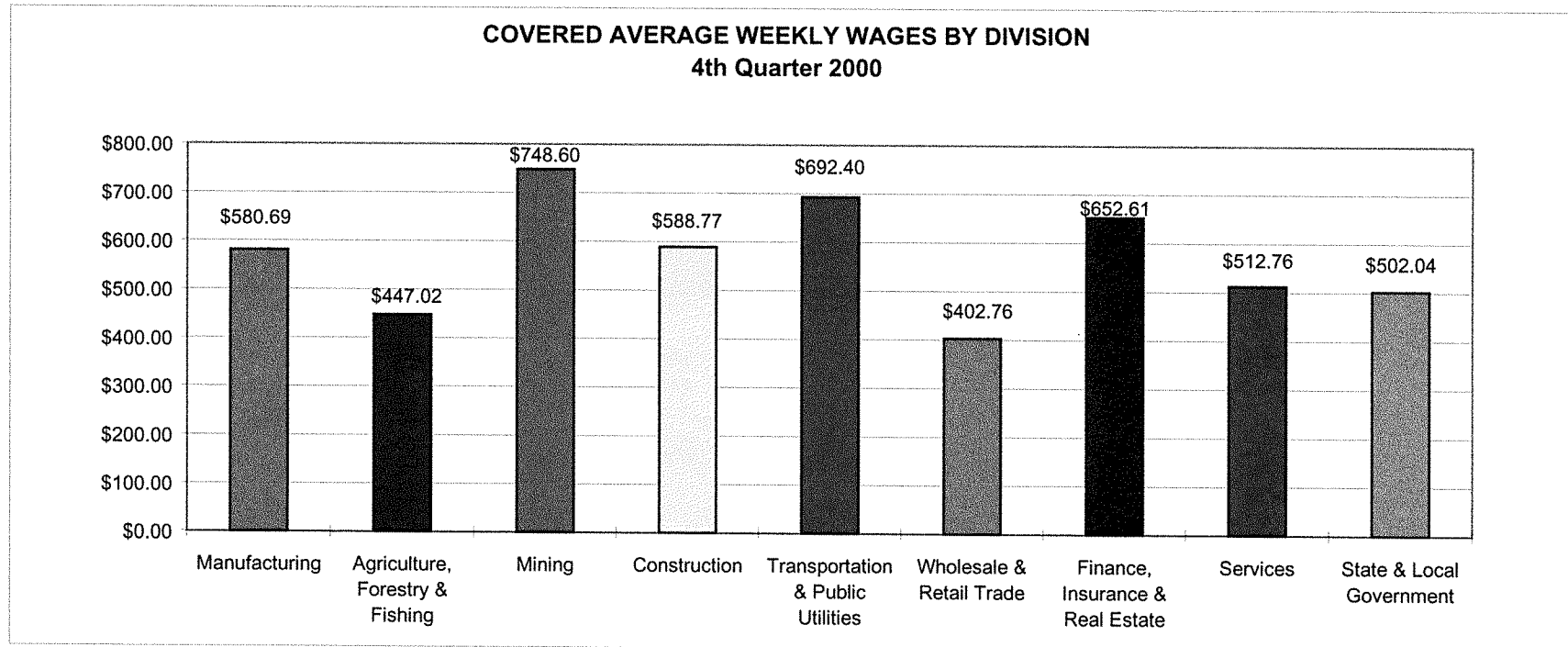

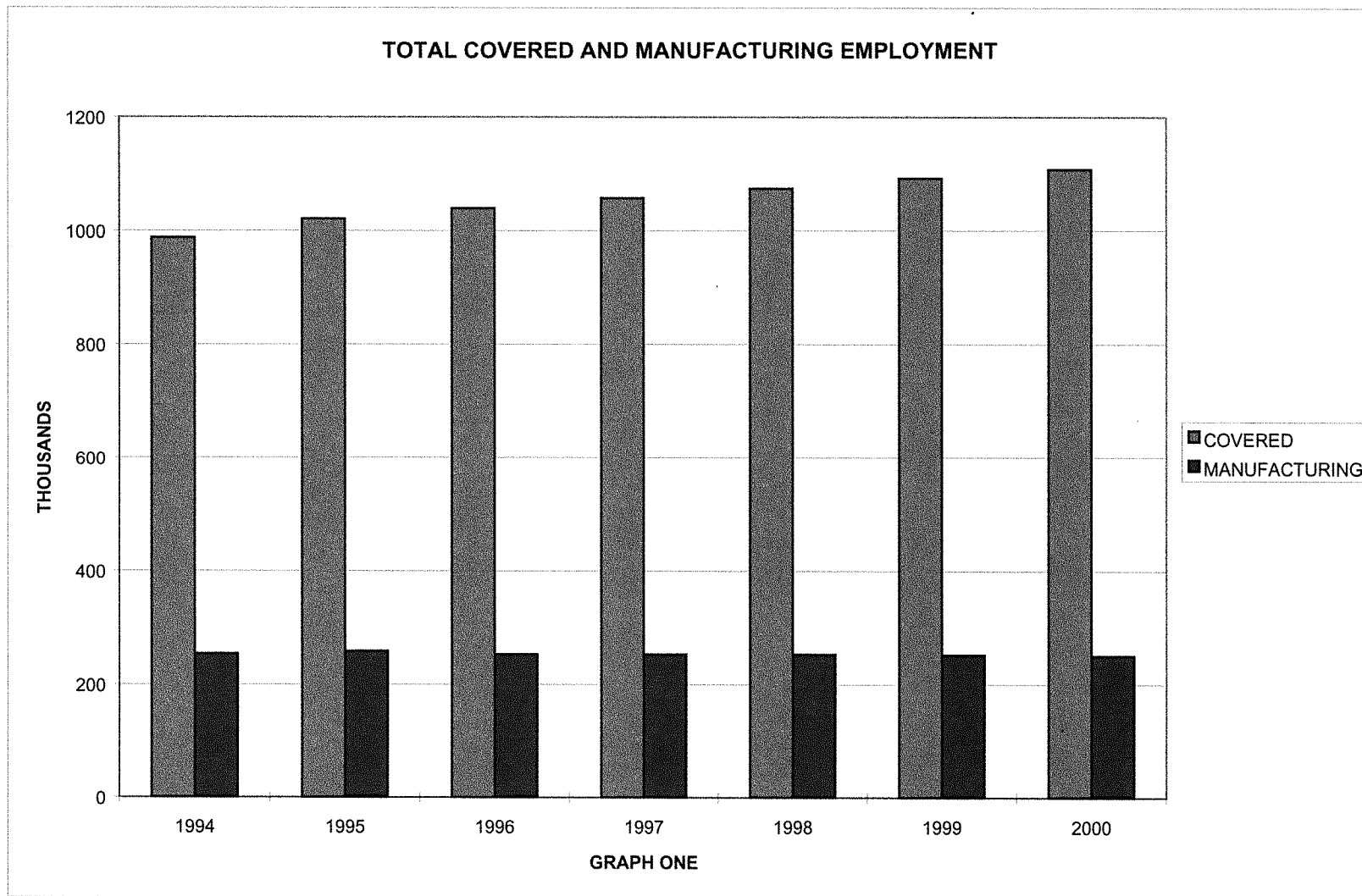

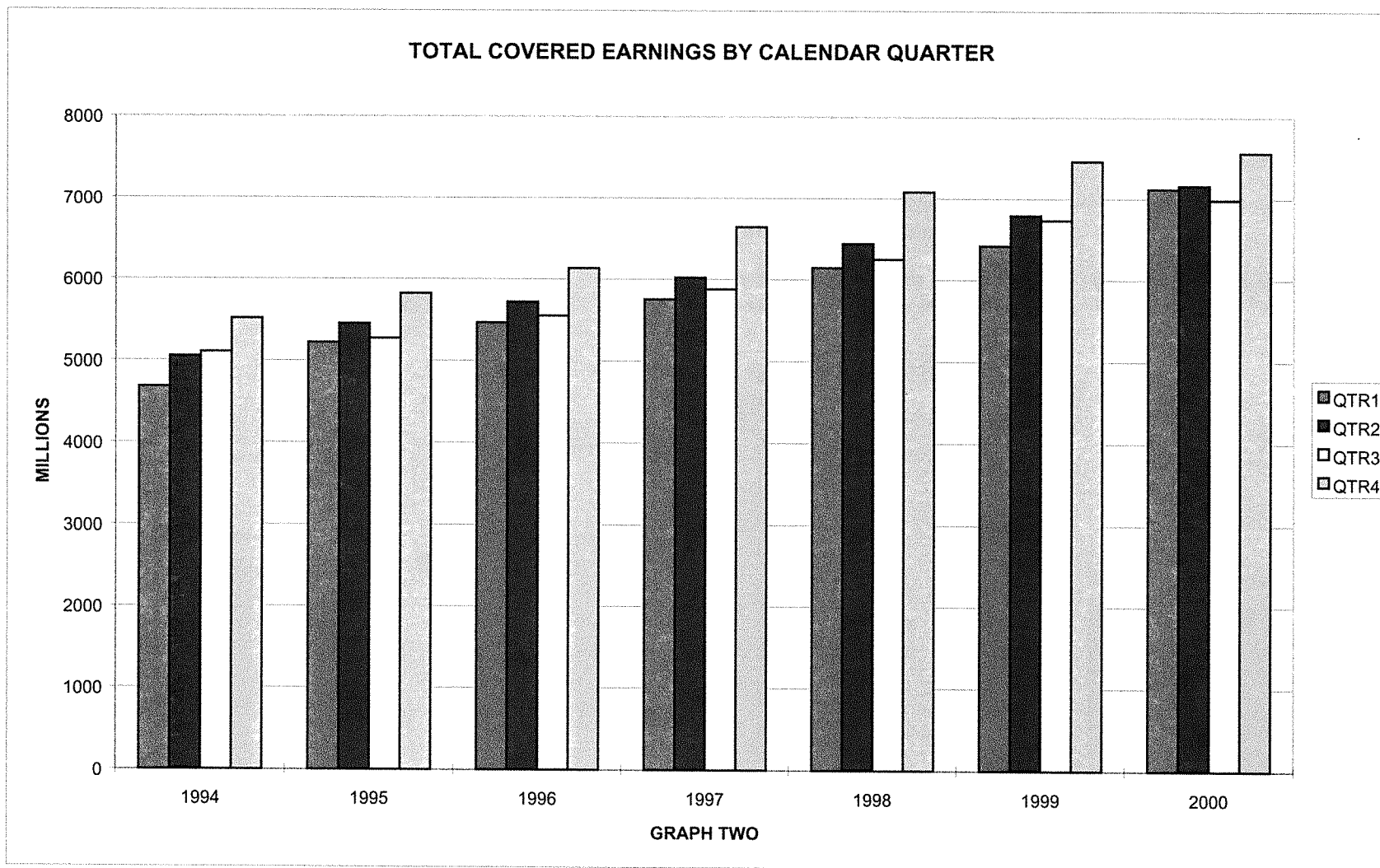
